From the Minister "Knee Deep In Spring Flowers"


In the 2013 Easter Sunday Edition of "Our Daily Bread", I came across a wonderful Easter story. It went like this:

"When the first flowers of spring bloomed in our yard, my 5-year-old son waded into a patch of daffodils. He noticed some debris from plants that had expired months before and remarked, "Mom, when I see something dead it reminds me of Easter because Jesus died on the Cross but he rose on Easter."

I replied. "When I see something alive - like these daffodils - it reminds me that Jesus died on Good Friday but then he came back to life on Easter!"

We have that assurance of life coming out of death because of what the great Easter stories tell us about Jesus' resurrection from the dead. The Gospel of Luke tells us of the risen Christ walking along a road to Emmaus with two of his disciples, three days after his resurrection. They ate dinner with him and, the story says, "Their eyes were opened and they recognized that it was Jesus who walked with them." This encounter showed the travelers that Jesus conquered the grave as the Old Testament prophecies said he would do, and as Jesus himself said he would do. He had risen from the dead and the disciples had seen him in his risen form. And these two disciples, filled with joy and awe, made their way back to Jerusalem to tell the other disciples the wonderful Good News:

"He is risen! He is risen indeed!"

Where would we be without Jesus' resurrection at Easter? Without Easter, our faith in Jesus would be pointless, and we would still be under the penalty of our sin (1 Cor.15:17). Jesus was raised for our justification from the way of sin so that we might walk in the way of Life. (Rom.4:25).

Today, we are made right with God by his dying but even more so by his rising again to life eternal.

That is the wonderful Good News of Easter! That is the truth that, "The Lord is risen, He is risen indeed!" (Luke 24:34)

Unfortunately, at this date, instead of 16%, we have only collected 11.5%. In other words, we have spent \$9,785 more than we have received.

At the Annual Meeting, the budget presented by the combined Session and Board was approved. It asks us all to give almost \$16,000 more to the Operations Budget this year.

Of the 168 envelope users, there are about 75 who wholeheartedly and regularly support the operation of this church and we are so thankful for your support!

If you are able, Tweedsmuir needs for you to prayerfully consider increasing your givings by \$225 per year or, \$4.50 per Sunday.

Simply get a PAR (Planned Automatic Remittance) form from the Office and increase your contributions to The General Fund by \$18.25 per month or increase your envelope by \$4.50 per Sunday.
